### **Governor's Salmon Workgroup to hold meeting in Twin Falls, Idaho**

Twin Falls, Idaho – Governor Brad Little's Salmon Workgroup will meet in Twin Falls on October 29 – 30, 2019. The public meeting will be held at the Herrett Center for Arts and Science at the College of Southern Idaho located at 315 Falls Avenue Twin Falls, Idaho 83301, in the Rick Allen Room.

The meeting will focus on hydropower operations, flow augmentation, and policy discussions to meet salmon and steelhead recovery goals. *The public is invited to provide comments to the workgroup. Each member of the public will be limited to three minutes, as time permits. Comments will be taken on a first come, first served basis. The workgroup will take written comments, all comments will be distributed to the workgroup. Comments will also be accepted by email to [species@osc.idaho.gov](mailto:species@osc.idaho.gov).*

Governor Little directed the Office of Species Conservation to establish a workgroup dedicated to addressing salmon issues. The workgroup held meetings in Boise on June 28, Salmon on July 30 - 31, and Lewiston on September 20; bringing together diverse stakeholders to collaboratively develop a unified policy recommendation to assist Governor Little as he shapes Idaho's policy on salmon recovery.

The workgroup will hold several additional meetings throughout Idaho to provide opportunities to share perspectives on salmon policy. The upcoming meeting in Twin Falls will be the fourth in the series; the next meeting being in Boise on November 19. Additional meetings will be scheduled for 2020. Those dates will be released in the coming weeks.
